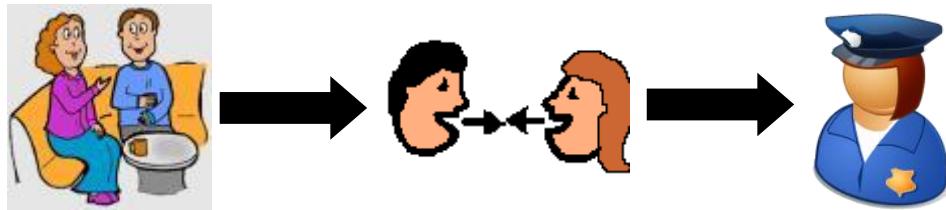
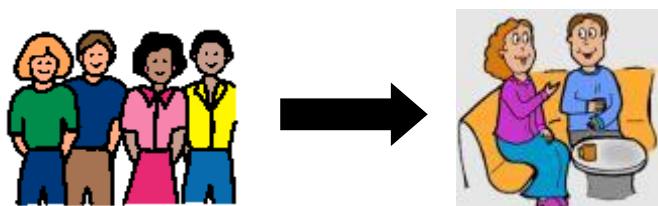


What's the Independent Third Person Program about?

- Know their Rights



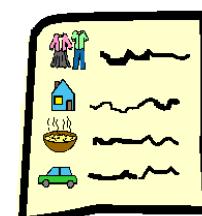
- Understand what's going on when Police are asking questions



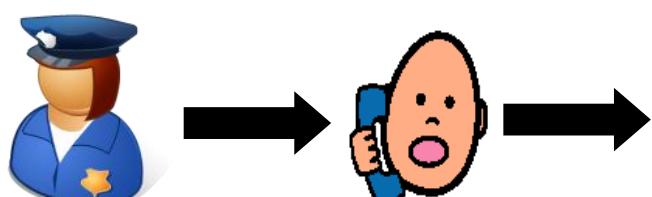
- Support the person who the Police are talking to
