

Coronavirus and the 'Single Social Bubble' Rules



The Victorian Government has made new rules for people that live on their own.



These rules are about the 'single social bubble'.



From Monday 14th September you can choose one person to be in your 'single social bubble' if you:

- live on your own
- are a single parent, with children under 18 years old



This means



- they can visit you at your home.
- You can visit them at their home, if no one else is at their home.



You cannot choose more than one person to be in your 'single social bubble'.



It must be the same person



You and the person in your 'single social bubble' must wear a mask all the time.



The person in your 'single social bubble' can live more than 5km from your house.



If you go out with the person in your 'single social bubble' you can only be together for 2 hours.



You can see the person in your 'single social bubble' any time, but you need to be home before 9pm, or you need to stay the night at their house.



When you are choosing the person to be in your 'single social bubble', think about if they, or the people they live with, need care or support because of:

- their age
- disability
- or health



If you or the person in your 'single social bubble' feel sick, you should not visit each other.
